I've promised Billy's fiancé Yvonne that I will continue to do whatever I can, as Billy's MP to secure his release as quickly as possible.

AT the start of September I was one of just five MPs to be invited by NERC (the National Environmental Research Council) to visit the polar research station at Ny-Alesund on Svalbard. The visit was organised to allow us to see the deeply troubling effect global warming is having on the
